# WHAT IS RECONCILIATION INITIATIVES DOING?

Reconciliation Initiatives, in collaboration with Coventry Cathedral, seeks to equip Anglican Christians and their communities to handle disagreement more confidently and skilfully, and to be agents for reconciliation in wider society.

We are doing this through establishing an **Anglican Peacemaking Institute** on each continent, in partnership with local organisations, beginning in Europe and Africa, and then further afield.

Our vision is to make a strategic contribution to:

- changing the culture of how Anglican churches handle their disagreements;
- how the Church contributes to bridging divisions and strengthening relationships in divided societies.

In doing so we seek to bring hope to the world

## ABOUT ANGLICAN PEACEMAKING INSTITUTES

#### What are Anglican Peacemaking Institutes (APIs)?

APIs are intensive summer schools which will:

- Equip small groups of leaders with thinking and skills for understanding and engaging better with disagreement and conflict, within the Church and beyond;
- Resource these groups to develop an action plan for their diocese, tailored to their context.

#### What will these diocesan action plans do?

They will:

- Propose ways to engage more fruitfully with disagreement within Anglican churches;
- Advocate approaches for how the churches can be more effective agents for reconciliation in wider society.

#### Who will participate in APIs?

Participants will be chosen by their diocesan bishop. They will be diverse leaders who are:

- Ordained and lay women and men, from diverse theological and social traditions;
- Christians in mid-career, with potential for senior leadership.

### WILL YOU HELP REALISE THIS VISION?

We need your support, both financial and in prayer, if we are to achieve this peacemaking vision. The initial budget for the first two years of operation is £300,000. The largest cost is the venues for the APIs, along with travel for participants. We will be looking for sponsoring bishops to make a contribution towards covering the costs of their nominees, but the majority of the budget will need to be covered by charitable donations.

One generous donor has already contributed £80,000 to get us off the ground. This covers most of our staffing costs for the first two years. Another donor has offered to donate up to £25,000 a year for each of the first four years as match funding to others' donations.

Thanks to the match funding, any gift you make can be doubled in value. That means your gift will make an even bigger difference.

We need support now, both financially and with prayer, to help Reconciliation Initiatives deliver our plan for Anglican Peacemaking Institutes.
